Herbert DeLima, Member of Bar, Dies at Age 58

Herbert A. DeLima, who, after being admitted to the Connecticut bar in 1930, practiced law in Greenwich and Stamford for several years, died yesterday at St. Joseph's Hospital. He was 55 years old and made his home on Whitney Ave., New Canaan.

Born in New York, Mr. DeLima attended Princeton University and studied law in San Juan, Puerto Rico, where he was admitted to the bar in 1912. He passed 17 years in Latin-American countries.

living in Ecuador, Colombia, Peru, Puerto Rico, Cuba and the Canal Zone.

He was a member of the bar of Connecticut, New Jersey, California, Montana, Colorado, Florida, the Canal Zone, Puerto Rico and Cuba. He was admitted to practice in Connecticut in 1930 and was until 1934 associated with Attorney Jackson Palmer of Greenwich, when he moved to Stamford and set up a law office in the Gurdley Building. In 1938 he originated a radio program, "Let's Go to Work," which was carried on the major networks for a considerable period of time.

Surviving are his widow, Mrs. Florence Geist DeLima; a daughter, Miss Sylvia DeLima; a son, Sergt. Herbert A. DeLima, jr., a sister, Miss Agnes DeLima, and two brothers, Arthur A. DeLima and Clarence A. DeLima, both of Mexico City.

Funeral service will be at the Franklin Hoyt Funeral Home, New Canaan, tomorrow morning at 11. Interment will be private.
