

JACOB SENIOR'S FUNERAL HELD

The funeral of Jacob Manuel Senior, of 124 Madison avenue, Endress apartments, who died Wednesday, was held yesterday afternoon, in the chapel, in Cypress Hills Cemetery, and interment was made there, Dr. Julius J. Price, of Temple Sholem, this city, officiating.

Surviving Mr. Senior are his wife, and one sister, Miss Hannah M. Senior, the latter living in Curacao, Dutch West Indies, and a step-son, Leupold Wolff, of 1203 Martine avenue, this city.

Mr. Senior was born in Porto Rico, and in early life engaged in the culture of bananas, owning a large plantation and exporting the products. For some years he lived in Baranquilla, Columbia, South America, and came from there to New York in 1869, and engaged in the commission business importing fruits. He moved to Plainfield in 1904. He went to France in 1912, remaining three years, and while there, his first wife, who was formerly Mrs. Wolff, died. He returned to Plainfield in 1915, having retired from business, and had lived here ever since, the first two years with his step-son on Martine avenue. On October 31, 1917, Mr. Senior married Miss Dahlia Henriquez, of Curacao, who survives him.

Mr. Senior was a linguist, speaking English, Spanish, French, and Portuguese with great fluency. He and his wife made many cordial friends in Plainfield, who regret to learn of his death.
