

MISS GURNEY AND EDWARD DE LIMA MARRIED.

Edward de Lima, son of D. A. de Lima, who founded the well-known South American mercantile firm in this city, and Miss Ruby Gurney were married at the Fifth Avenue Hotel on Wednesday. Mrs. de Lima is the daughter of Silas Gurney, formerly proprietor of the Tremont House in Boston, who now lives in Saco, Me.

Young de Lima caused a sensation by disappearing from his home in this city in December, 1891.
